Not out of entities hiding from the light because they wanted to do nefarious and illegal things, but out of carriers of the light looking to illuminate a place in the darkness. You will choose what you share, when and with whom.</p> <p>The Random Skies team tell us that www.randomskies.com could be taken down at any time, as they are not currently running on their own servers through a Reach backbone. Some darknet posts are rerouted to the general public through The Switching Station, if they are deemed relevant to Random Skies, but they are independently posted and in no way affect our operation. The first sign will be if the Random Skies series of novels is delisted by Amazon, and they start selling directly through the website. After that the battle against the ISPs will be their own, and we will do what we can to help spread the word. Remember, what happens in America, comes to Europe shortly afterwards. Brexit never happened, America has fallen, and there is a storm gathering on the horizon. Good luck everybody.</p>
