

# Larp Rising

These are my impressions: having reported on some of the UK input into both Libya and Syria since 2016, I find myself assessing London with a similar set of criteria. London has roughly the same population as Libya and right now, both of them look like failed states. The survival of the infrastructure now relies entirely on aid from the government. What was previously paid from the commercial life of the city is now backstopped by money printing from the Bank of England, and 'granted' to the councils on terms that have never been established or reported. It's hidden behind institutional covenant and the BoE's 'lender of last resort' status. The high street banks are simply stockpiling money against an inevitable future collapse that will leave their customers' deposits entirely worthless. At this point, where private business has become untenable, the new government allowance system will kick in, sending UBI directly to people's bank accounts. I believe it will come with strings attached.</p> <p>This is a fair equivalent of what happened in Libya. A sequestration of (in their case) national assets, by the people who attacked them, and the remaining population locked down in transit cities. Do not be surprised if there are reports in the alternative media about people trying to escape from London! This is not a joke, or a wild exaggeration. We've all seen how traffickers are getting people out of Libya in boats and sending them north to Europe. The sub-Saharan Africans among them have been brought a long way by organisations from within Europe itself, in order to flood Northern Europe during this time of zero borders. The native Libyans are escaping from their 'police.' These are roving semi-autonomous gangs of costumed thugs, arresting, intimidating and robbing any citizens who are caught out in the open. Compare this behaviour with the increasingly unhinged behaviour of the British police. London is not a safe place. Those who are still on the streets, rather than obeying the nonsensical lockdowns on the pretext of medical emergency, are not going to be complying with the police. They are the gangs who will continue to operate come what may. They are increasingly well-armed, they know every CCTV camera (a feat in itself) and they use an encrypted phone network, and sophisticated surveillance network of their own.</p> <p>Do not be fooled by the television pictures that you are shown. They bear no resemblance to the situation on the ground. The media are cleverly using subliminal stories to give the impression that everyone is happy and 'obeying the rules' but the truth is very different. The streets are heavily patrolled and anyone who is not absolutely compliant is risking arrest and insane fines.</p> <p>It may sound like an exaggeration, but that's just a sign that you are getting used to it. I can assure you, that the more this resembles the national emergencies of the Middle East, the less this has to do with any medical event.</p>
